<u>Session 1</u>: Reform of the Bank's Procurement Policy - Implementation of the new Procurement Policy and related challenges (10:30 to 12:00)

- <u>10:30-11:00:</u> Presentation of the Bank's new Procurement policy for projects, including harmonization with other MDBs, in particular in regard to the recently-approved revised World Bank procurement policy and co-financing and mutual reliance agreements

This presentation will present the main areas of the new policy framework, while emphasizing on impact the new procurement policy will have on the effectiveness of Bank's operations and economic and social development of the Regional Member Countries (RMCs). Finally the session will serve to exchange on implementation challenges to be taken up, including capacity building of Bank's staff and RMCs.

Ways to go forward will be suggested as an input for the following discussion with the Bank and representatives of the African private construction sector.







- <u>14:30-14:45</u>: The case of Performance-based road maintenance contracts, and their possible use for the development and training of the local industry

Based on his experience with the road sector, Michel Démarre will call to mind that in the long term, procurement procedures can impact the structure of the construction industry. It is therefore relevant to study how procurement procedures could help in developing the private construction sector in Africa. In particular, long-term performance-based road maintenance contracts could help in this respect and contribute to set up a local industry and train their staff, while contributing effectively to road maintenance, provided certain conditions are met, which will be discussed in his presentation.
